The Upper Oxford Township Board of Supervisors held an advertised work session at the township building, 1185 Limestone Road, Russellville, PA on Monday, February 25, 2013 at 7:00 P.M.

ACT 537 Plan was discussed. Ron brought the Supervisors uptodate on the mapping exercise and the affect Kings Mill would have on Russellville if the development rights were sold. The high density zoning in Homeville was discussed along with their bad soils, bad topography and small lots. Ron will move forward onto the next level of anaylsis. Ron will also call Mark Gallant at Chester County Planning to see how the Act 537 would apply to the Regional Comprehensive Plan.

ACT 167 – Was discussed by Wes Horner. Wes reported that the last few months the schedule has fallen apart put will be presented to the commissioners very soon. Wes was pleased to inform Upper Oxford Township that they have been included in the “Going Greener” application and will receive approximately \$15,000 to \$20,000 to spend on their project. Wes also stated that volunteers would be very much appreciated in helping with the project. The Supervisors suggested that the township’s park committee “re-visit” the park plan. Also discussed were the possibilities of plantings in the park, moving the recycling containers and putting a drive to the pole barn off of Catamount Road. Ron Ragan will meet with Chester County Conservation District to discuss the permit renewal.

ADJOURNMENT – There being no further business, the work session was adjourned at 8:30 P.M.
